
LUNCH AND LEARN SESSIONS & PROFESSIONAL RESOURCES

Through powerful storytelling, authenticity, and warmth, he shared his journey of resilience, gratitude, and hope—reminding us of the strength found in community and the importance of caring for one another.

His engaging style, positive spirit, and heartfelt message left attendees motivated, reflective, and encouraged to face challenges with compassion, perseverance, and faith.

It was truly a highlight of the conference and a moment many will carry forward long after the event.

Artificial Intelligence


The IBM presentation on Cybersecurity and AI in K-12 Business Operations offered school business officials a timely and practical look at how boards across Canada are strengthening digital security while preparing for responsible AI adoption.

Participants learned about current threat trends in education, including the rising sophistication of attacks and the increasing importance of identity protection, strong data governance, and proactive planning. A practical cybersecurity checklist highlighted essentials such as MFA, managed SOC services, secure backups, vulnerability assessments, and clear incident response and continuity plans.

The session also explored the rapidly evolving world of Artificial Intelligence, emphasizing both opportunity and caution. Ontario's AI trust and governance framework and Gartner's AI TRISM model were discussed as key guides to ensure AI use is transparent, secure, equitable, and well-managed.

Real-world examples showcased how tools like Microsoft Copilot can support productivity in areas such as finance and HR when implemented thoughtfully and securely.

Overall, the presentation reinforced that while technology continues to advance quickly, school boards can confidently navigate risk and realize value by prioritizing readiness, good governance, and strong security foundations.



OCSTA Finance and Labour Presentation

OCSTA Executive Director - Patrick Daly

OCSTA gave us an overview of Finances at Ontario Boards. The presentation highlighted the growing financial challenges facing school boards as rising operational demands continue to strain already limited budgets. Significant cost pressures are being driven by increasing special education and student transportation expenses, expanding technology and infrastructure needs, and ongoing investments in digital resources, capital projects, and temporary accommodations.

Sick leave utilization under current collective agreements is adding further operational and financial burden, while staffing costs and statutory benefit contributions such as EI and CPP continue to rise. Compounding these pressures, the moratorium on school closures limits opportunities for boards to find meaningful cost savings.

In addition to financial pressures, boards face heightened cybersecurity risks and the emerging need to responsibly implement and manage artificial intelligence tools.

These evolving priorities require both funding and specialized planning to ensure protection, continuity, and strategic use of technology.

From a compliance perspective, 66% of boards are currently balanced budget compliant. However, several boards continue to face ongoing deficits, with some experiencing three consecutive years of shortfalls and deeper cumulative financial challenges. Ten boards now require Minister approval after exceeding allowable deficit limits and must develop and follow formal In-Year Deficit Elimination Plans. Continued monitoring and support will be essential as boards work to stabilize finances and maintain services for students.

Overall, the presentation underscored the urgent need for sustainable funding, strategic planning, and proactive measures to navigate the financial, technological, and operational realities facing school boards today.

We would like to extend our heartfelt gratitude to the members of OCSBOA and all those serving in Business Official roles across Ontario's 29 Catholic School Boards. Your work is essential to the smooth and effective operation of our school systems and has a direct, positive impact on fulfilling the mission of Catholic education in our province.

As the Bishops of Ontario wrote in their 1989 Pastoral Letter This Moment of Promise: "There is no such thing as 'just a job' in a Catholic school. There are only various forms of Christian service, each calling for extraordinary service."

These words resonate deeply with the dedicated men and women who faithfully serve in Business Official positions. Over the years, we have witnessed individuals at boards such as Hamilton-Wentworth Catholic District School Board exemplify this extraordinary service, living their vocation with commitment and integrity.

We also commend OCSBOA for selecting the theme for this year's conference: Navigating Change, Empowering Growth. In today's dynamic environment of publicly funded Catholic education, reading the signs of the times and leading change with boldness and prudence is more important than ever. As one thoughtful reflection reminds us, "Courage is when you risk something for the sake of something that is genuinely good."

Your courage and dedication exemplify this truth and are vital to the continued strength and growth of Catholic education.
