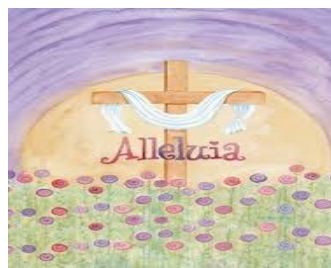

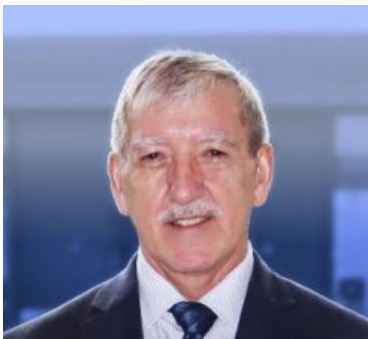

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Tech Tips and Tricks

Lets Talk about Artificial Intelligence!

Artificial Intelligence, or AI for short, is a branch of computer science that focuses on creating systems or machines that can perform tasks that typically require human intelligence. These tasks can range from understanding language, recognizing objects in images, making decisions, or even playing games like chess or Go.

AI systems learn from data. Just like how we learn from our experiences, AI systems learn from the information they're provided. They use algorithms, which are step-by-step instructions, to process this data and make predictions or decisions based on it.

There are different types of AI:

1. **Narrow AI:** Also known as Weak AI, this type of AI is designed for a specific task. For example, your smartphone's voice assistant, like Siri or Google Assistant, is a narrow AI because it's focused on understanding and responding to voice commands.
2. **General AI:** Also known as Strong AI or AGI (Artificial General Intelligence), this type of AI would have human-level intelligence and could perform any intellectual task that a human can do. We haven't achieved this level of AI yet, and it's still a subject of ongoing research and speculation.
3. **Machine Learning:** This is a subset of AI that focuses on enabling machines to learn from data without being explicitly programmed. It's like teaching a computer to recognize patterns and make decisions based on those patterns. For example, machine learning is used in applications like recommendation systems (like those used by Netflix or Amazon), fraud detection, and autonomous vehicles.
4. **Deep Learning:** Deep learning is a type of machine learning that uses artificial neural networks to process and learn from data. These neural networks are inspired by the structure and function of the human brain. Deep learning has shown remarkable success in areas like image and speech recognition.

AI is being used in various fields, including healthcare, finance, transportation, and entertainment, to automate tasks, improve efficiency, and even make new discoveries.

Bill 124

In 2019 the Ontario government announced a bill, Bill 124, to cap salary increases for public sector workers to one per cent a year for three years. An Ontario court has declared it unconstitutional ruling that it infringes on the workers' rights to freedom of association and collective bargaining.

OBSCU has negotiated a retroactive increase for education workers as a result of its agreement with the province.

OSBCU says the deal would retroactively compensate education workers with 0.75 per cent increases for 2019-2020 and 2020-2021. It would also include an amount between 1.5 per cent and 3.25 per cent for 2021-2022, which will be determined by an arbitrator.

The union says wage rates in the 2022-2026 collective agreements will also be increased and wage hikes will be pensionable.

OECTA and government have agreed to an additional 0.75 per cent in each of the first two years of their previous contract and they were awarded an additional 2.75 per cent for the third year, amounts that are on top of the one per cent raises each year that were part of the previous contract under Bill 124.
